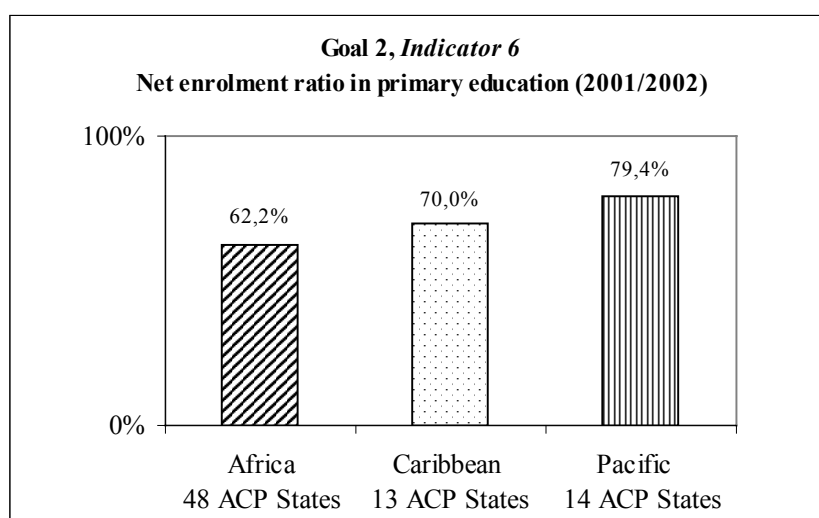

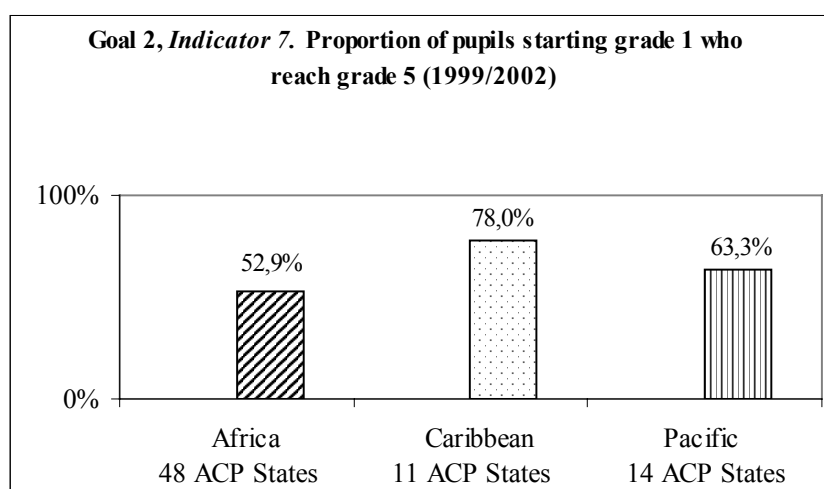
General Notes

- *ACP States* considered in this study are only the 77 ACP States signatories of the Cotonou Agreement.
- The "*Pacific 14 ACP States*" group includes: Cook Islands, Fiji, Kiribati, Marshall Islands, Micronesia, Nauru, Niue, Palau; Papua New Guinea; Samoa; Solomon Islands; Tonga; Tuvalu; Vanuatu. This geographic area is made up of 6.697.000 people.
- "*Caribbean 15 ACP States*" group includes: Antigua & Barbuda, Bahamas, Barbados, Belize, Dominica, Dominican Republic, Grenada, Guyana, Haiti, Jamaica, St Kitts & Nevis, St Lucia, St Vincent & the Grenadines, Suriname, Trinidad & Tobago. This geographic area is made up of 22.760.000 people.
- "Africa 48 ACP States" group includes all Sub-Saharan African Countries. This geographic area is made up of 609.500.000 people.



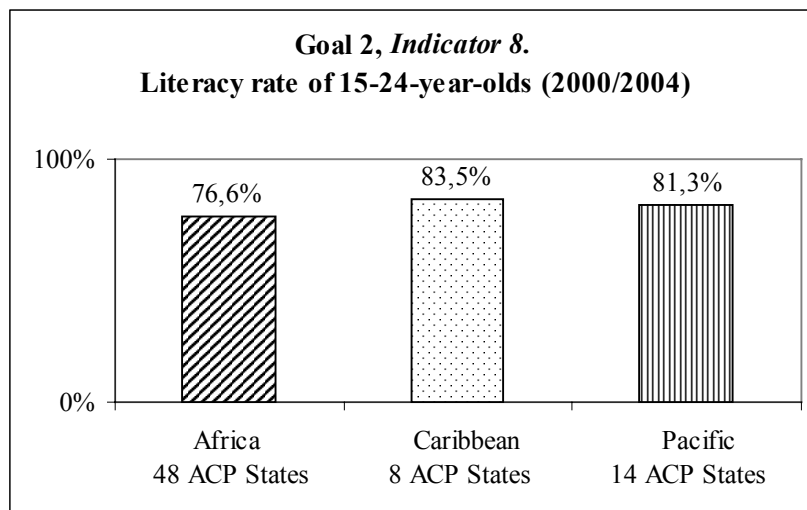
Note 1. The last census from Haiti has been carried out in 1990.

Note 2. "*Caribbean 15 ACP States*": data for Antigua & Barbuda and St Kitts & Nevis are not available but they are not statistically relevant due to their relatively small population (141.000, that is 1% of the total "*Caribbean 15 ACP States*" population).



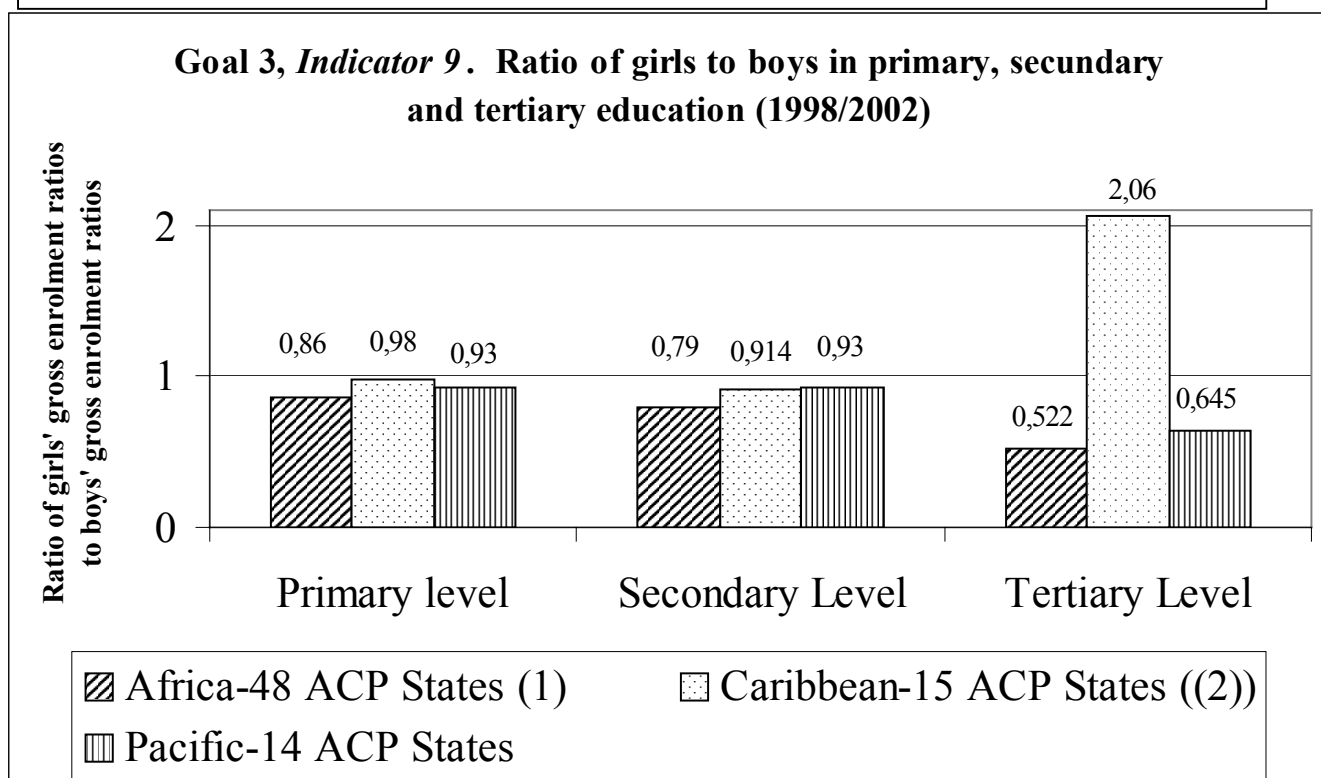
Note 1. The percentage indicates the proportion of students enrolled in the final grade of primary school.

Note 2. "*Caribbean 11 ACP States*" includes: Barbados, Belize, Dominica, Dominican Republic, Guyana, Jamaica, St Kitts and Nevis, St Lucia, St Vincent & the Grenadines, Suriname, Trinidad and Tobago. Data for Antigua and Barbuda, Bahamas, Grenada, Haiti are not available: these countries represent 37,3 % of the total population in the "*Caribbean - 15 ACP States*".



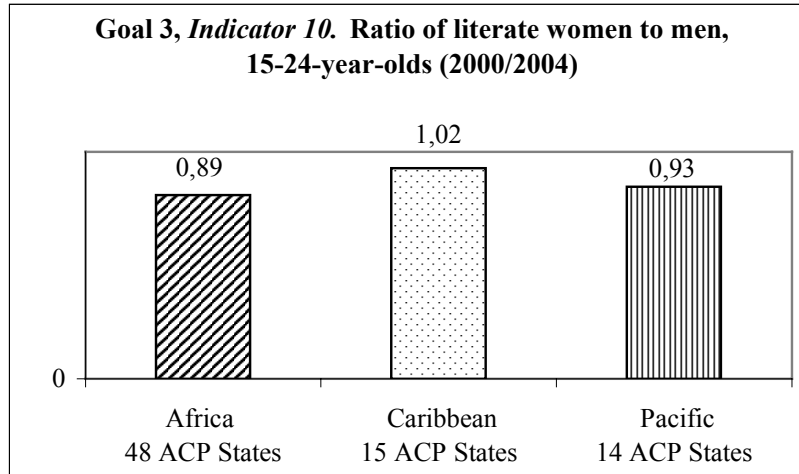
Note 1. Data refer to the latest literacy estimates and projections released in March 2004 by the Unesco Institute for Statistics for the reference period 2000-2004.

Note 2. "Caribbean 8 ACP States" includes: Bahamas, Barbados, Belize, Dominican Republic, Guyana, Haiti, Jamaica, Trinidad & Tobago. Data for Bahamas and Guyana are based on a census carried out in 1990. Data for Antigua & Barbuda, Dominica, Grenada, St Lucia, St Vincent & the Grenadines, Suriname, St Kitts & Nevis are not available but they represent only 5% of the population in the "Caribbean - 15 ACP States".



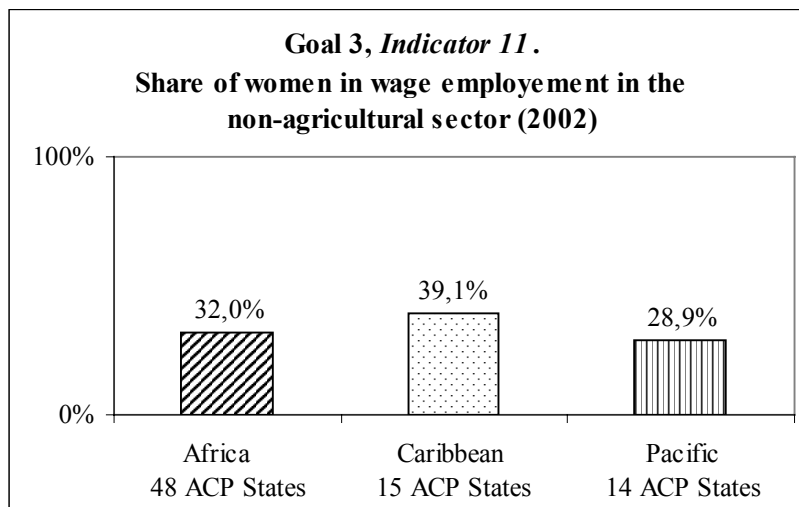
Note 1. "Africa- 48 ACP States": With regards to tertiary education, figures are not available for Gambia, Nigeria, Senegal, Seychelles, Somalia (which represent 20,5% of the "Africa-48 ACP States" population). Last censuses available from Guinea and Mali have been carried out in 1990.

Note 2. "Caribbean-15 ACP States": Data for Haiti concerning both primary and secondary education are based on a census carried out in 1990. Primary education data from Antigua & Barbuda were not available. Secondary education data for Antigua & Barbuda and Grenada are not available. As for tertiary education, it was possible to find data only for 5 ACP Caribbean States: Barbados, Jamaica, St Lucia, Suriname, Trinidad & Tobago (21,1% of the total population in the 15 ACP Caribbean States).



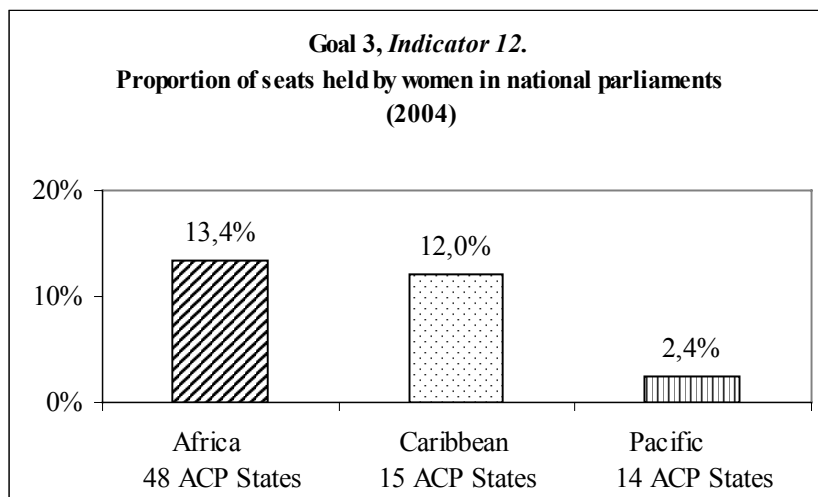
